

Lesson Title: How beautiful is the world!

Objective:

Discovering God's Beautiful World:

To help children understand and appreciate the beauty of the world as a gift from God.

Introduction:

(Ice breaking)

Begin by asking the children what they think makes the world beautiful. Encourage them to share their thoughts and observations.

Teaching Points to be covered:

God's Creation: Explaining to the Childrens that how God created the world and everything in it. Explaining in brief about Adam and Eve's story. *(showing few images of the majestic aspects of earth)*

Appreciating Nature: Teaching children to appreciate the beauty of nature around them. Encouraging them to go on a nature walk with their families and observing the flowers, trees, birds, and insects around them.

Caring for Creation: Explaining the importance of taking care of the world that God has given us. Discussing simple ways how we can help, such as picking up litter, recycling, and conserving water.

Gratitude: Teaching children to be thankful for the beauty of the world and the blessings it brings. Encourage them to say a prayer of thanks to God for his wonderful creation.

Practical Application/Habit Formation

Thank God for beautiful creation we say everyday in your prayers.

Activities:

Pictionary: playing a game with Children to identify the drawing made. *(eg. animals, waterfalls, mountains etc.)*

Nature Collage: Provide children with magazines, coloured paper, and glue. Let them create a collage of things they find beautiful in nature.

Outdoor Scavenger Hunt: Create a list of items for children to find on a nature walk, such as a colourful leaf, a smooth rock, or flowers.

Planting a Seed/sapling: Give each child a small pot and some seeds. Let them plant the seeds and watch them grow, teaching them about the beauty of new life.

Sing the song: Teach the song given in the text with action

Bible Verse: write and learn

Conclusion:

Wrap up the lesson by reviewing what the children have learned about God's beautiful world. Encourage them to continue exploring and appreciating the beauty of nature around them.
