Lesson 5: GOD WHO PROMISES THE SAVIOUR

Objective:

Children will understand that God felt compassionate towards them, promised them a saviour. God came in search of them.

Starter:

1. Show the pictures of a doctor, firemen, and police officer. Tell what each person is and then see if they can tell you what each have in common. Guide them to see that they all help save people from danger.
2. These people help people in need and often save people from harm or even death.
3. We have a SAVIOUR who saves us not only from physical harm but also spiritually.
4. Does anyone know who our SAVIOUR is. Our Savior is Jesus Christ

Presentation:

1. Use stories from Genesis (about Adam and Eve) emphasizing God's plan to send someone special to save His people.
2. Use simple language and engage the students with questions throughout the story to ensure their understanding.
3. Give importance to God's compassion and love and promised a SAVIOUR so that they may be saved.

Practical Application:

- Praying and talking to God when they are scared or worried.
- Praying to Jesus the savior when bad dreams comes.
- Remembering that Jesus loves them no matter what.
- Showing kindness and love to others because God was merciful to Adam and Eve even though they sinned.
- Loving all your friends at school even if they have done any wrong to you

Bible Verse: write and learn the Bible verse

Mathew 1:21

"She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

This verse emphasizes that Jesus is the savior of the world.

Activity 1 - Mercy Chain:

1. Explain to the students that they will be creating a "Mercy Chain" to demonstrate how acts of kindness and compassion can link together to show God's love in action.
2. Distribute strips of paper and markers to each student.
3. Instruct the students to write or draw one act of kindness or compassion they can do for someone else on each strip of paper.
4. Once the students have written/drawn their acts of kindness, help them form the strips into loops and connect them together to create a chain.
5. Hang the Mercy Chain in the classroom where everyone can see it.
6. As a class, discuss how each act of kindness contributes to the Mercy Chain and reflects God's merciful love.
