JESUS WHO REVEALED THE GLORY OF GOD

Objective

By the end of this lesson, students will recognize

- How Jesus revealed the glory of God through His miracles
- Will develop deeper trust in Jesus' presence and power in their own lives, especially during times of fear, trouble, or doubt.

Introduction

Show pictures of different things and let the children identify them. Compare between living things and non-living things.

Presentation of the Topic

"Have you ever had a problem that seemed impossible to solve? What did you do?"

Story:Once there was a young boy named Aaron who went on a school field trip to a forest reserve. During the nature walk, he got separated from his group and couldn't find his way back. Scared and unsure, he remembered what his mother always told him, "Jesus is always with you. Just pray." So Aaron sat on a rock and whispered a prayer asking Jesus to help. A few minutes later, a guide from the park appeared and led him safely back to his group.

Aaron learned that even when no one else can help, Jesus is always present and able to do the impossible.

This is exactly what today's lesson is about—how Jesus revealed God's glory by doing miraculous things that no one else could do.

- At the wedding in Cana, He turned water into wine, performing His first public miracle and revealing His glory in response to His mother's faith.
- In the midst of a terrifying storm, He calmed the winds and waves with just a word, showing that He has authority even over nature.
- When He encountered the man at the pool of Bethesda, who had been sick for 38 years, Jesus healed him instantly, proving that God's glory is not limited by time or human helplessness.
- Finally, by raising Lazarus from the dead after four days, Jesus revealed Himself as the resurrection and the life, demonstrating that even death submits to His power.

Through all these signs, Jesus not only solved immediate problems but also invited people to believe in Him. Each miracle became an opportunity for faith and a moment of glorifying God.

Practical Application

The miracles of Jesus are not just historical events—they hold deep meaning for our lives today. Just as Jesus helped those who faced hopelessness, fear, and death, we too can turn to Him in our moments of struggle and trust in His power and love. When we are going through difficult times—like fear during exams, problems at home, or feeling lonely—we can be confident that Jesus is with us.

Habit Formation

To see the providence of God in the victories and defeats of my daily life

Activity

1. Miracle Skit:

Divide the class into small groups. Assign each group one miracle (Cana, storm, healing, or Lazarus).

• Let them act it out with a focus on how people responded to Jesus' actions and how they glorified God.

2. Faith Reflection Card:

Ask each student to write down:

- A difficult situation they are facing or have faced.
- A short prayer asking Jesus to show His power in that area.
- One sentence of belief, like Martha's: "Yes Lord, I believe..."

Encourage them to take it home and keep it in their prayer corner.

Bible Verse

John 11:25

"I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live."

Conclusion

Encourage students to reflect on God's love in their daily lives.
