- 5. *The Fulfilment of Commandments:* Examine Jesus' teachings on fulfilling the commandments with love and compassion, contrasting the Old Testament legalism with the New Testament ethic of love.

Practical Application:

- *Practical Usage in Daily Life:* Discuss practical ways to incorporate the Commandments into daily life, fostering habits of kindness, honesty, and integrity.
- *Habit Formation:* Encourage the formation of habits aligned with the Commandments, such as regular prayer, Sabbath observance, and acts of charity.

Commandments and Clues:

1. **First Commandment:** "You shall have no other gods before Me."

2. **Second Commandment:** "You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain."

Symbol: A wedding ring.

Clue: "Promises made, promises true, find this clue where vows are due."

7. Seventh Commandment: "You shall not steal."

Symbol: A small lock or key.

Clue: "Honesty is always best, find this clue where treasures rest."

8. Eight Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."

Symbol: A pair of lips or a truth sign.

Clue: "Truth is strong, lies are weak, find this clue where we speak."

9. Ninth Commandment: "You shall not covet your neighbours wife."

Symbol: A picture of a man or woman representing desire.

Clue: "Be content with what is your own"

10. **Tenth Commandment:** "You shall not covet your neighbours goods."

Symbol: A toy or object representing desire.

Clue: "Be satisfied with what you own."
